The Blazing Star Quilt Tour

Two women from the Des Moines Presbytery attended the Dakota Presbytery meeting at Good Will Church in Sisseton, S.D., on October 3-5, 2014. They were welcomed with open arms and learned much about the Presbyterian Women of the Dakota Presbytery.

The Des Moines Presbyterian Women have pledged to support them. One way we can do this is by displaying the "Blazing Star Quilt" which was made by the PW of the Dakota Presbytery in our churches and then sending a monetary contribution to the PW of the Dakota Presbytery.

The quilt has been displayed at First Presbyterian Church of Oskaloosa and is presently on display at the First United Presbyterian Church at Winterset. It will be there for our PW's Spring Connection meeting, April 25th, where it can be passed on to another church. A bag has been made to transport the quilt from church to church and has information about the quilt and where to send the money.

Synod Gathering Date is Set!

The Synod Gathering is June 15-18, 2016, in Sioux Falls, SD. They are using the theme, "Lord, Make Me an Instrument of your Peace." The event location will be held at a hotel instead of sleeping in dorms at Buena Vista University. One of PW's national staff people from Louisville will be speaking. It is hoped that more Native American members can come since it is closer to them. We are also striving to bring in a younger population because of shopping in the town.

Three Sisters Soup Recipe

Simple Cooking with Heart brings you this interesting vegetable and bean soup called Three Sisters Soup. This is actually a Native American recipe and the three "sisters" refer to corn, beans and squash! Serves 6; 145 Calories; 87 mg Sodium; price per serving: \$1.80.

Ingredients

6 cups fat-free, low-sodium chicken or vegetable stock

16 oz canned, low-sodium yellow corn or hominy, drained, rinsed

16 oz canned, low-sodium kidney beans,

drained, rinsed

1 small onion, chopped

1 rib celery, chopped

15 oz canned, cooked pumpkin (Tip: Be careful, don't get pumpkin pie filling!)

5 fresh sage leaves **OR**

½ tsp dried sage & ½ tsp curry powder

Directions

- 1. Bring chicken stock to a slow boil.
- 2. Add corn/hominy, beans, onion and celery. Boil for 10 minutes.
- 3. Add sage leaves, curry and pumpkin and simmer on medium-low heat for 20 minutes.

Plan to attend the Churchwide Gathering!

The Gathering will be held June 18-21, 2015, at the Hyatt Regency in Minneapolis, Minn. Christian women (and a few men and children!) from across the country and around the world come together for this triennial event. Past Gatherings have included people of all ages and from more than 20 countries. The Gathering theme, "One Body, One Spirit," based on 1 Corinthians 12:12–27 (NRSV) will explore the entire passage, paying particular attention to verses 12–13: "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free and we were all made to drink of one Spirit."

Things to do at the Gathering...

- Optional field trips to local Presbyterian, mission-focused and cultural sites.
- Join in worship with sisters in faith from around the country and the world
- Hear uplifting music and gifted preachers
- Find inspiration in the plenary (large group) sessions of Bible study to mission projects.
- Learn about your areas of passion and key issues in the world today through forums and workshops led by inspiring speakers.
- Get excited about the future of PW at the Business meeting, where our 2015–2018 PW leaders will be elected, a budget and programs will be finalized.
- Witness the installation of the newly elected leaders of PW's Churchwide Coordinating Team.
- Visit the many exhibits and shop in the marketplace and bookstore.
- Take in some of the fun spots that Minneapolis has to offer.





Full registration is \$395. Hotel, travel and some meals are additional. Those needing a one-day registration pay \$125.

Housing and programming are all under one roof at the Hyatt Regency. Room rates are \$169 per room, per night, for one to four persons per room, plus tax.

Unfortunately, PW Churchwide scholarships are not available for this Gathering. However, consider applying for (or donating to!) scholarships through your local PW in your congregation, presbytery or synod.

It touched my heart through examination of my heart and changed me in ways that I didn't know needed changing.
